The Dumoine River Valley has a long and rich history. Native travellers carved out portage routes and created campsites hundreds of years ago. Loggers have harvested the surrounding forest for over 250 years. Hunting and fishing have brought passionate sports people to the area for more than 100 years. For over 50 years, canoeists have enjoyed the beauty and challenges of the river.

Today the Dumoine continues to provide a unique wilderness experience because of its relatively undisturbed status. But it can't last. More and more mechanization and technology is changing each recreational experience. River access points are increasing, each user group is growing in size and impact. The economy will continue to create demand for Dumoine Valley wood. Every year a new water diversion project is proposed that could affect the Dumoine watershed.
